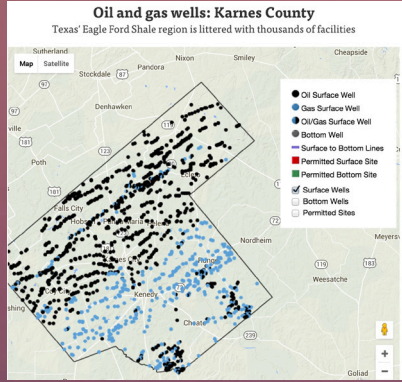


Breathless in Texas
